We reached very late in the evening. Such journeys have taught me that when you have a destination nothing makes sense until you are there. Having a destination is very important for any achievement; whatever we set out to do we must have a direction.

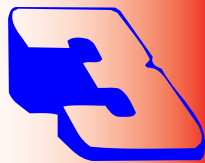

For you to take a bold step and touch the untouched will require you to purpose to do so. The human being many times will not risk for nothing, because even risks must be rewarding and this is only possible with a clear purpose. Identifying purpose requires us to search our hearts and within our being discover who we are and what we are called to be. This will direct us towards our calling. Mother Theresa used to say “Few of us can do great things, BUT all of us can do small things with great love”

There is a lot of business duplication in our country where you will find everybody doing what everybody does. My mother opened up a saloon 20 years ago on a main street around the suburbs of Kampala and this was the first of its kind on the street and she earned greatly. Five years down the road, that street in less than 300 metres had over 10 saloons all offering the same services, now as I write this there are over 30 saloons many of which last for around 2 years and close. This in time has affected her business but so are other saloons because they are competing for the same clients. My mother is not alone duplication of business is the order of the day. This would not be possible if they had passion or something new to offer everybody just does the same. Many are doing business because someone else is earning profitably from it. When profits are not fourth coming they run away.

The only way to move from that scenario is to reach into yourself and touch the untouched that passion, that dream, that talent which nobody else has but you. My mother’s saloon has lived a test of time because she is passionate about her job. Since I was an infant I

have seen her do but one thing --- *take care of women's hair*. This has seen her educate all her children through university, take care of an extended family, buy her own home but all this from nothing but taking care of women's hair across decades. Do you think all has been well with her all the time? No, but her passion for hair is unimaginable.

I remember my second book "*Understanding Student Leadership*" after its launch; I set out to market the book since it was a potential source of income for my new business. For many months I set myself into the field to sell books. The more I continued to do this, the more I felt lost, the more I began unsatisfied even after a sale, the more I was not challenged but routinely followed what I was supposed to make the organizational grow at the expense of my true self.

During the long holidays for students at a certain point I was broke; I fully engaged into my writing again. This period was a great vitality for me, as I felt fulfilled and destined to live with a pen and paper in my hands. I felt a belonging that transcended the desire for cash and in less than two months I had finalized two books which are already in the market. I realize then and now that though marketing is very important for my books it's just a desert I can deal away with. I therefore set out to identify promoters to market my work as I continue to offer the world what I do best—Write and teach rather than write, teach, sell, promote, and more.

Finding where you belong will ignite a passion that cannot be quashed even with challenges around you. Many times as I wrote including this book I did not know where the funds will come from to publish it but that did not matter and neither did it make sense to me. I just kept writing and moving along with my teaching empowerment schedules. I refused to stop dreaming, I

just continued to do what I love doing best. I have a friend who loves cooking and I guess she would spend her last day on earth in the kitchen if she knew. Cooking comes naturally to her and she also loves to serve it in a way that would make 5-Star Hotels envious! Unfortunately she did a course in accounts, No wonder she is always frustrated about her job. She has no passion for it whatsoever but she earns a living from it. I have asked her a thousand times why she has not moved into the food industry and also use her financial skills to manage and grow her business and in an annoyed tone she replies *"Do you want me to be jobless Allen?"* *"But you have a special skill in foods you will employ yourself and many others?"* I reply. *"Allen; stop this nonsense of yours!"* She fumes with anger. Off course I back off *"Ok for now I will stop but start to think about it anyway?"* I say. My friend is not alone so are many others who are frustrated earning their living thereby accepting a life of mediocrity. This is a choice they have chosen and the consequences are seen in many ways like unproductive work force, work related stress, diseases, etc.

The power of passion can only be understood among people like Nelson Mandela staying convicted in advocacy for equal rights for every South African at a cost of 27 years in Prison. My friend pastor Judith is passionate about praying, she will pray from morning to dusk, from dusk to morning, she will preach as if Jesus is coming now, passion of spreading the gospel oozes naturally out of her, you can easily see that she is in love with ministering. That is the same thing that drives me as I write this book. It can only make sense if you are passionate about it. Jesus on the cross is the most vivid example of passion with purpose, if you have watched the award winning film called the 'Passion of Christ'; you can tell the power

in pursuing dreams with a passion. Jesus while praying for His journey to Golgotha cried tears of blood and He accepted the cross with no fuss or fear rather He accepted in humble submission. This great lady became a mother to many of us and because of her passion for Safe Motherhood together with other icons in this field Professor Mirembe of Mulago Hospital, Dr. Pius Okong of Nsambya Hospital and others went ahead to create a campaign of ensuring that No mother or child should die due to pregnancy related complications in Africa. This is seen through the many initiatives done including Save the Mothers Program at Uganda Christian University. This great woman oozes with passion for mothers and their babies.

Emmanuel my friend is a guy who can sell you anything. He is so excellent in what he does that wherever he has been as a marketer he has been promoted as head of marketing. He has moved across companies who fight for his skills, he is now employed with an international company as their Head of Marketing. He does marketing with a heart and he does it with a passion and over the years has excelled whenever he has been placed. What are you passionate about, how much? What are

you willing to die for? Touching the untouched requires energy which is not sold or bought rather its inherent. Many times as I sit on my desk searching for the way forward with no obvious answer it's only passion that drives me giving me stamina beyond self.

I remember in the beginning of the year 2009 it was a very tough year for me. I had massive accumulated bills, the enthusiasm Future Learning Centre had started with dwindled and so did the morale. I had massive dreams but I had no money sometimes even transport to take me to nearby places or even communicate was becoming tougher but as a founder I promised myself that I could not afford to give up never. This was a trying time for me, I almost threw in the towel, and whatever happened everyday just confirmed what I had dreaded when people talked me out of this venture. During that time I learnt how to mediate, and stay focused to the end. The beginning ceased to be and I looked ahead into the unknown. Many times I went to teach the concepts of abundance mentality with a loud voice inside me shouting *"make it work for you"* Many times I felt continuing was extremely hard but I had made a definite choice that I will and I will.

That is the time when everything conspired against me including machinery, money, and man. I pushed on and during that time I concentrated on writing this book which is a testimony of that time. I wrote it at the lowest point in my life, broke, lonely, and messed up. I just concentrated as Theodore Roosevelt said "Do what you can, with what you have, where you are". I only had a pen, paper, and I just used that.

What am trying to show you is that many times we look

at the glory of successes without looking at its cost. There is a cost attached to everything including the decisions we make. My choice resigning from my job had a cost most especially a financial implication which rings louder in your ears when broke. The sacrifice you make now will impact on you now and what you will become. However the reverse is true, when we work without passion, you can earn millions which on face value looks good but this cannot be sustained for a long time because lying to oneself is the hardest thing to do. Soon you will be dragging yourself from bed to work, stress levels will increase and your performance will be affected. Imagine if you are a doctor, but your heart is into motor care what will happen? You will probably find a doctor who treats patients as machines. Many times you might even go back to school looking for satisfaction but to your dismay after many years later still, you will be asking what happened as the soul remains empty. Now imagine the same scenario with a doctor with passion, this is where you will find a person who looks forward to another day in hospital, that's where you will find service with a personalized touch. That is where you will find a minister rather than a worker.

We all need to find where our passion is, where we can cry tears of blood and accept the cross to pursue our divine purpose. To do this requires feeling pain that will stimulate you into action. The face value of Pain is not good, it hurts body and soul, pain of ill health, pain of losing a loved one, pain of unemployment, poverty name it all, it's all painful. Beginning of 2008 I lost my truest and closet friend in the Kenyan riots after the 2007 elections a humble soul. The shocking news and pain was overwhelming and for so many months I was lost. When I latter surrendered this pain to Christ

I started to remember the passions of my friend's life which we shared a lot and decided to do something. Has this experience been good, it has been horrible; many times I would fall back to crying, many days I spent them in unimaginable pain, I regretted the days I wasted, the letters I never wrote, the calls I never answered, the presents I didn't buy, when I could have appreciated him more, I dearly missed him. Nevertheless, today I can boldly say that this pain has reshaped my life and who I am now. I am starting to appreciate great friends, I can just write a message to express my gratitude, I easily do this to show appreciation because I can never know how long I will be with the people who care and love me. Has the pain gone, yes and No but the lessons are black and white.

In **2 Corinthians 12:7-10** Paul speaks about a thorn in the flesh which was given unto him. He says he pleaded with the Lord three times that it might depart from him and it didn't. And what did he do he says in **verse.10** *"therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in needs, in persecution, in distress, for Christ's sake. For when I am weak, then I am strong"* Such powerful conclusion can only be attainable through passion.

The only thing which will sustain you in adversity most especially as you pursue the untouchable in you is vision with a passionate heart. These will fuel you to keep keeping on.





Touching the Cents in you

“...I have come that they may have life and that they may have it more abundantly” *John 10:10*

As we continue living our life we have to understand that we have already been given much according to our tasks. Whatever we have been given we have to multiply it, increase it, and be fruitful. What happens can be reflected in the parable of the Talents in **Mathew 25:14-30**. Three servants were given five, two, and one cent respectively. The first two multiplied theirs in double portions, while the one with one cent buried his in the ground and waited for his boss to come back and hand it back to him. This was a disaster that his master declared him an unfaithful servant and sent him to outer darkness. He said “... *Cast the unprofitable servant into the outer darkness...*” This situation is no different from us today who have been given talents but have not bothered to multiply them.

We have all been given cents to use in various forms wherever we are; but the most important question is how we use them:- the talents, potential, and natural abilities to advance the Kingdom of God and make our communities better places (multiplication effect) to live

in. Some of you are employed, how are adding up to the company, others are volunteering, what value are you adding to your place of work. Shall we be like that man with one cent, who saw no value in the little he had so he buried it or shall we complain of how hard our country and community was that we could not get capital, the technology was poor, the roads where impassable, the people where hostile, corruption was at its peak. There was no favourable political environment and so many other challenges you could talk about and therefore we decided to bury the cents. Shall we complain about the little pay, leadership flaws, unfriendly bosses, poor working conditions, and so many other challenges we face in our work place. What are you using the cents you have, are you busy multiplying them, have you have buried it or worse still you have lost it, so that you can't even give it back.

Multiplying our cents requires cultivating a sense of purpose. Mukeleya must have been born with a screw driver in his hand! He is a technician not by schooling but by default, when you give him any electronic device

broken or damaged he will repair it within a flash of an eye. He says wherever he is in front of machines he feels complete and he cannot

rest until he has repaired everything he lays his hands on. In 2012, his workshop which was booming was hit by economic challenges and it completely shut down. This saw a radical change in his life and he decided probably he needed to change vocation so that he can earn money to make him establish his workshop again and also take care of his family. Three years down the road, he went into farming but his heart is dead. You can tell from his toxic words that he is a dying man; he is doing a career that does not suit his personality and passion.

He has joined the club of complainers, confused people, and conformers.

Mukeleya is not alone, the need to eat, sleep, cloth, provide education, and health care is very essential for every family and is a priority for our everyday living. This cannot be disputed and obviously, the pains of hunger are merciless and walking naked even if you are genius is not acceptable. We thus need to rely on the social support and also inculcate business sense into our talents and gifts. For example I am passionate about writing and most of my time I spend it either writing or teaching. The rest on income generating activities, socialization, and offering community services while taking off time for rest and mediation. In that way I have managed to spend more time on the passion of my life without necessarily affecting other important elements of my life. However, this is a temporally arrangement for me because sooner, I will be earning millions from my cent to sustain me comfortably. The good news is that I will be spending less time on non-important things which are not essential. This means the time I am now using for income generation will be put to multiply my cents even further.

Touch the untouched requires courage, it requires stamina, and it requires believing that you can. There should be no doubt that you can't, certain words and thoughts are very

destructive just like rat poison. Did you know that in rat poison there is only 1% of poison which actually kills? The rest is nothing but rat food, however 1% is what kills a rat. Most times challenges before us are food to sustain us and nurture us. However, we usually end up with 1% that kills us off completely. While beginning Future Learning Centre, a team of vibrant people joined

the vision, 2 years down the road everyone's drive and audacity including me was very low. This was a litmus test for me especially as a founder but also as a believer in *Never ever give up*, I nearly gave up and let go but only one thing kept me going courage just like *Ralph Waldo Emerson said; "Whatever you do, you need courage"*. Whatever course you decide upon, there is always someone to tell you that you are wrong. There are always difficulties arising that tempt you to believe your critics are right. To map out a course of action and follow it to the end requires some of the same courage that a soldier need at the battle line.

Today I am grateful for his hiccup because it has made me purpose my work even more. Many times the bigger the challenge the bigger the rewards if you can only hang on there. I believe our strength lies not when we are driving on a tarmac road but when we get to that

bumpy road and still hang on. There is a story of a two young men who were lost in a very thick forest without direction on how to get out, they continued moving around the forest for days

without direction, in their exhaustion, hunger, and fear they prayed and behold a star appeared moving and beckoning them to follow, they wisely followed the star without taking their eyes off. One of them through the corner of his eyes saw something sparkling as gold and he called his friend to stop and examine this treasure. He excitedly picked it only to find a rotten fruit. He arose to continue on his journey but the friend and star were nowhere to be seen. He remained lost in the forest while his friend was home with his family telling tales of their adventures.

Knowing where we are going is a waver against challenges and those sparkling things before us when we are following our stars. This sounds selfish, yes because when we are following a dream our eyes need be on the star alone. Jesus had 12 disciples including those that swore loyalty to him in life and death. Nevertheless, at the time of carrying the cross there was no one near him, but he carried the cross with dignity, without fussing, and complaining about the disciples disappearing. He remained focused on his goal *“to die for sinners so that we could have eternal life”* I like the song that says *“at the cross he saw me”* If we are to touch the untouched we cannot afford to waver, but we should carry our cross while our eyes are on the star walking towards it.

I walk in faith every day of my life looking at my star, dreaming of my multiplying my cents. The spackles of everyday life when they don't align within focus, they don't attract my attention. One of the people that have totally inspired my life is my friend who practices the power of focus. From the day we met, he had everything right with him; he is handsome, very composed, oratory, SMART, a dedicated Christian, great community worker, with many young people idolising him for his service role and a rewarding job! It's no wonder that every woman fussed about him, we became friends eventually but the most attractive element on him was his focus that couldn't be swayed! Due to his character he climbed service ladders very first and three things are important for him God, family, and service in that order. He used to tell me, *“when everybody is going west, don't go until you find your own compass”*. This has worked and still works for me! So ask yourself which compass I am following. To touch the untouched requires us to follow our own direction, to map our life, and dreams. This book is about self-discovery, it's about finding yourself, and it's about finding YOU in YOU.

Moses spent 40 years in the wilderness after fleeing from Egypt. In those forty years he carried a rod while looking after his father-in-law's sheep though he never got to use it for others. Probably he used it to protect himself and the animals against the enemy, period! However, in the burning bush encounter with the Lord, the value of the rod changed and it became one outstanding tool which Moses used to further God's kingdom. Another classic example is David, he was a man used to subdue the moment with what he had. When he accepted to take

Operating within the Untouched Zone

Touching the untouched means moving from the zone we all like to operate from, the comfort zone to that which makes us sweat, instill fear, and at times painful.

The comfort zone is not necessarily comfortable rather we make ourselves comfortable there. For example I have always dreaded hand washing clothes most especially on the weekend which takes almost 3-hours of my precious morning, since I want the clothes to dry. I grew up seeing my mum do what I do now cooking food, washing clothes, washing food utensils, look for

our daily bread, and also take care of us. However three decades latter I am finding myself in the same routine dragging through life (never mind I am in an era of washing

machines but they are expensive in my country, and electricity tariffs are rather high!, I voluntarily abstain), but if someone was using their cent in technology an intermediate device which is cheap and user friendly would be made so that every home most especially women would be able to buy for use.

These are things we do and they look essential but add no value to us for example what I have discussed above. I know many women complain of this which does not mean that it's not noble rather we are doing what could be done easily in a very hard way, when we can still use the same energy to multiply our cents in multi-fold. My granny always said *"if you are using a lot of energy in doing something, just know that you have not applied wisdom"*. Its sad that Uganda an agricultural economy is still underfunded, under-mechanised, and under-prioritised. We don't produce enough food to sustain the households and therefore the whole country. This is a shame? There is no reason whatsoever why we are not growing enough food.

People joke that in many parts of this country you throw a bean in the morning and by evening it has grown and harvest starts the next day. My Pastor says that when you bite an indigenous mango you feel as if you have touched heaven. Uganda is truly gifted by nature! But the saddest truth is that it's one of the poorest countries with nothing to show about its giftedness as witnessed by the high rates of malnutrition, poverty levels, famine, high maternal rates, high fertility rates, deplorable infrastructure, and many other conditions.

These are alarming bells, but they are also opportunities to be harnessed by all of us, for example everybody talks about the poor reading culture in this country most especially for non-academic products, but for me this is an opportunity to harness by venturing into areas that are not catered for; such as extra-curricular books, inspirational books, and spiritual books. The response from the target audience is welcoming for now but I am certain that this will soon change and every time I get an extra reader, I get excited. There is no reason

whatsoever why each using their cent cannot be an answer in some way to address some challenges;

Nightingale Ruth Kalinda is a reflection that no matter what we can make our destiny and become social transformers in our time. Nightingale is the second child and first girl child in a family of 10 children. At nine months old, she was diagnosed with polio at a time when anyone with polio was stigmatized and regarded as a victim of witchcraft. As a child and teenager, she was particularly vulnerable to dropping out of school since she was lame and a girl! Despite having qualified to study Medicine at Makerere University, she was denied the opportunity to enrol for such a course since there was reluctance to have a lame female doctor. Nightingale persisted and eventually qualified as the first East African Physiotherapist in 1956. After practicing as a Physiotherapist and qualifying further as an Occupational Therapist, she realized the limitations of hospital-centred practice. She began a campaign for Community Based Rehabilitation, a new approach to health intervention. This saw the creation of Community based approaches in health care interventions. She also devoted her life to advancing her profession especially in support of people living with disabilities. Her campaign advocated for visibility, fairness, and equal access to opportunities especially in education, health, and community acceptance of the disabled.

The Aids Support Organization, TASO is a household name in Uganda and the world and continues to be a model of HIV/AIDS positive living, care, treatment, and support for people around the world. TASO exists because of the dedication of 15 individuals led by Dr. Noerine Kaleeba, who were infected or/and affected by the HIV/AIDS scourge and boldly set out to contain the stigma associated with the disease in those days. Founded in 1987, Noerine had no time for self-pity and

simply plunged into the work of building the institution which has become a center of excellence and dedicated health care provision.

The late Rev Canon Bartholomew Musoke Zimbe (1845-1946) is one of the most generous yet little known philanthropists of his generation. He gave up a privileged Buganda Chieftaincy position and lifestyle in the Buganda Kingdom and converted to Christianity. He then devoted his life to advocating for the abolition of slave trade that was common practice in the 19th Century; growing the Church in Uganda and establishing schools, and hospitals. His philanthropic deeds include; the donation of the land on which many churches, mosques, hospitals, and schools were built in Buganda. He also donated his house and land where the present Synod Hall is at Namirembe Cathedral. He was also a family man who spread the gospel on foot across the country to Bongo Zaire and Tanzania. He served the church, Buganda Kingdom, and God with much diligence for 30 years at St. Paul Namirembe Cathedral as a Rev Canon.





Touch your Fears

We too ought to face our fears and rise up again and again to take the moment and pursue what we crave to touch.

For over 3-years I moved around teaching principles in touching the untouched and many people had challenged me into the realism of these principles. I hate performing averagely but here I was doing exactly what I hate.

I decided to do soul searching, face my fears, and in the process a company was born. A month later I resigned from my work to pursue this as a full time career. Today, years later I look back and see that my fears where genuine and well founded but I had to rise above them to reach out and touch the untouched in me. This has taught me not to place fear in front of my decisions which would make me

But we can decide to add on the extra by touching our fears and moving forward. This will give us an edge on our lives and the potential within us will blossom.

Today it's amazing the energy and zeal in which I exhibit at my workplace, nobody pushes me neither I am getting paid, but I have a fulfilment exhibited in the purpose of my work. I am writing this because when you hold this book, it looks as though it is roses for the author, the struggles of life deeply covered.

Presently, when we read and hear the amazing story of Jesus it's either simplified or gentrified. This does not help us appreciate the struggles our Lord and also the everyday life situations he had to face which we also face. But when you read the bible **Mathew 26:36-45**, these verses show you that the son of man had his fears as well **verse. 38** say "...My soul is exceedingly sorrowful, even to death. Stay here and watch Me", he continued to pray "...O my Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from Me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as You will." **verse. 39.**

Man's fears have proved valuable over time and so even us we should harness fear for our own growth.

Many times when talking about courage, I have just words which are very passionate to my heart. To some, words are nothing but action is power. not use our God given passions, talents, gifts, and other special abilities that the creator has given to us for self-gratification and glory but rather use it to further His Kingdom.

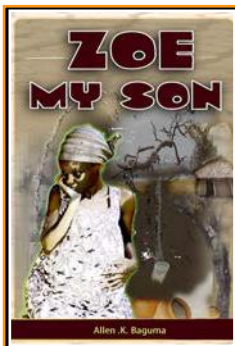
